Note: **Top row** (left side) of each square is the normal ENGLISH character keyboard position;

Second row is the SHIFTED key position;

Third row is the UNSHIFTED key position. Note: the back-quote key gives a very narrow-width blank space character

- ---- "dead" or double-strike keys are B-11 and C-11. Characters on these keys need to be pressed twice for that character to print.

- ---- Key C-11 shifted, is the "dead" (overstrike) apostrophe. Normal use is sh-U.

- ☐ This symbol on the chart indicates "currently unused ..." (d038) The " ` " (A1) key gives a vary narrow SPACE; used before periods, commas, quest.marks (d161)
